## AUGUST 30 1999 - THE BLOOD BAND IS AWASH IN ALLEGATIONS OF THEFT AND FRAUD BY TRIBAL ADMINISTRATORS [Alberta Report by Will Gibson]

As Floyd Many Fingers surveys the Blood First Nation reserve, a vast expanse of prairie twice as large as the city of Calgary, he sees a land rich in potential but for many generations now desperately poor. Mr. Many Fingers, 72, still mounts a horse every day to check the cattle herds of nonnative ranchers that lease Blood land for grazing. He is one of the few band members with a job, on a reserve where an estimated 80% of the 7,300 residents are on welfare. In the region surrounding the 331,000-acre reserve just south of Lethbridge, the unemployment rate is hovering around 4%.

While the rote response of most native politicians to complaints about social and economic conditions on reserves is to blame governments for failing to transfer enough off-reserve tax dollars into band council coffers, former Blood chief Harley Frank sees things rather differently. Mr. Frank, who now farms on the reserve, notes that a five-year self-government deal signed in 1995 between the band and Ottawa pumps \$42 million a year into the reserve, with scant beneficial effect. "This is insanity because nothing has changed, nothing has improved," he says.

Mr. Many Fingers, who served on the band council in the 1970s, blames the current chief and council and Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) for the reserve's myriad social and economic problems. "There is a lot of turmoil," he says. "We live in a bad place." So bad, in the view of Mr. Many Fingers and four other band members, that they have launched a lawsuit against the chief, the band council and INAC alleging that the band's electoral system violates Blood political customs.

More money. may, in some ways, have made things worse. Messrs. Many Fingers and Frank point to at least three investigations involving allegations of corruption against band employees. On July 31, for example, former band land manager Lyman Tailfeathers pleaded guilty to theft over \$5,000. He had been charged April 8 with theft and fraud following an 18-month RCMP investigation, which began when over \$300,000 in band funds went missing. Constable Gus Maurice, a Cardston RCMP officer who headed the investigation, says the fraudster was collecting rental fees from non-native farmers who lease land and grain bins on the reserve, and funnelling the money into a personal account.

The band's tribal police confirm that they are currently investigating another allegation of fraud within the reserve's land department. "All I can say is, yes, and that's it," says Sergeant Walter Coles.

Another investigation centres on the activities of two social workers who toil within the band's welfare bureaucracy. Brent Singer and Juanita Creighton administer a program under which band members on welfare get \$ 1,200 every two years to buy new furniture. Typically clients go to one of the furniture stores in Lethbridge, pick out the furniture they want and present the bill to their caseworker, who pays the store.

Banking records and tax documents. filed in the 1997 divorce and 1998 bankruptcy of Linda Gould-Hawke, former co-owner of the now-defunct J&L Furniture in Lethbridge, show that in the mid-1990s, Mr. Singer and Ms. Creighton received a number of cheques totalling \$15,000 and \$13,000 respectively from Ms. Gould-Hawke's store. When another former store employee' brought the 'payments to the attention of the local media, the band council hired private detective Dave Broughton; a retired RCMP commercial crimes investigator, to examine the case. According to Blood financial advisor Randall Spohn, Mr. Broughton wrapped up his investigation August 13 and his report will be passed to the "proper authorities." Mr. Spohn would not specify whether that meant the RCMP, the tribal police or some other agency.

Ms. Gould-Hawke says she did not view the payments made to the Blood social workers as direct inducement to get more clients to her store. But she kept on paying Mr. Singer and Ms. Creighton until early 1998, when she says her lawyer- and accountant told her that it was wrong. "I never thought about it. I was just trying to survive," insists Ms. Gould-Hawke, who now works as a cashier in a department store. "It seemed like it was a part of business.

Blood financial advisor Spohn says the investigations into the Bloods' land and welfare departments show that the system is working because it has ferreted out problems within the band administration. "I would be worried about an organization where there was no allegations because then I would be concerned about whether our controls were wrong, he says.

Ms. Gould-Hawke, however, questions the band's enthusiasm to investigate its own. She claims that after she came to believe that it might be wrong to give thousands of dollars to people who were handling her customers' money, she made several complaints to the tribal police, but nothing happened. The police only came looking for her, she says, after the media got wind of the situation. At point, she decided not to co-operate with the private detective hired by the reserve to look into her concerns. "Broughton represents the reserve and I don't trust anybody from the reserve anymore," says Ms. Gould-Hawke.

Her skepticism is shared by former Blood chief Frank, who believes that near-universal welfare on the reserve suits the self-interest of band officials and INAC bureaucrats. "If we were suddenly to become very wealthy and self-sufficient, a lot of civil servants would lose their jobs because there would be nothing to administer," surmises Mr. Frank. Moreover, he adds, it is almost inevitable that people who work in a welfare system that intentionally fosters the chronic dependence of its clients will be debauched by it. "It breeds corruption," he says. "It breeds crime".

## BRIEF HISTORY OF BLOOD TRIBE LANDS DEPARTMENT

July 21, 1999: Former band land manager Lyman Tailfeathers pled guilty to theft over \$5,000. He was charged April 8 with theft and fraud following an 18-month RCMP investigation which began when over \$300,000 in band funds went missing. 2000-2014: Lyman Tailfeathers was replaced in band land management by his nephew Elliott (Tailfeathers) Fox who became Director of Blood Tribe Lands Department.

March 2001 to January 2013: In his position as Lands Director Elliott (Tailfeathers) Fox received personal cheques totalling \$35,720.00 from non-native farmer Joachim Hengerer and Hengerer Farms. For what? Shake-down money to secure land leases?
